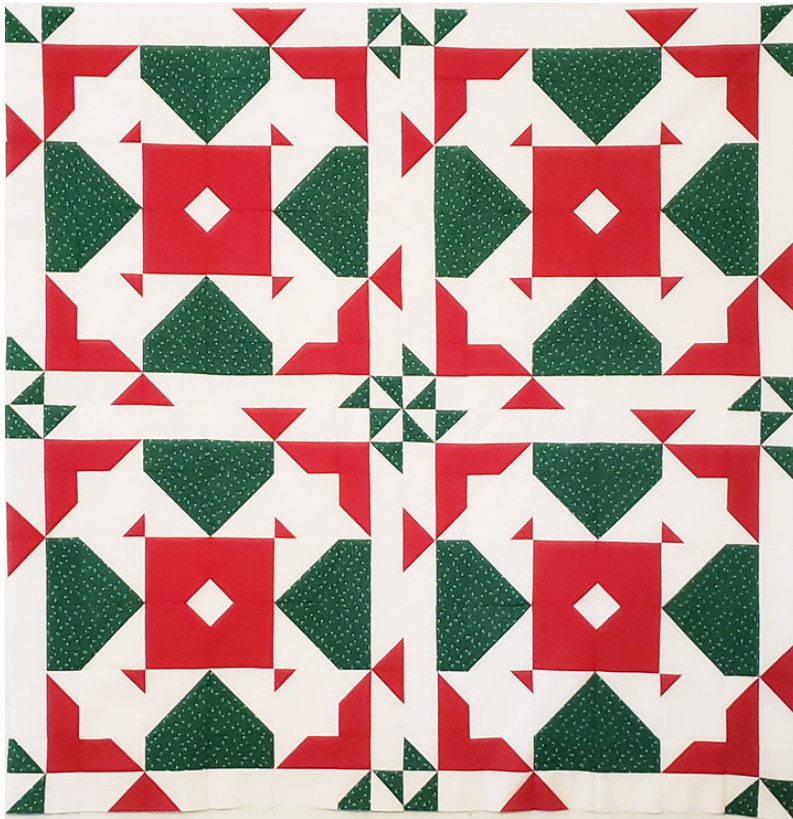

Information for Quilters with Questions

Jubilee - A Disappearing Block Quilt



You will make four 6 3/4" squares of fabric for each block. One each of red and green and two squares of white (or very light) fabric.

These squares were turned into four HST blocks and trimmed to 6 1/4". (Or you could use your own favorite method for making HST's). Open the HST blocks and press them to the dark side.

Arrange the HST's to make this block to the right.

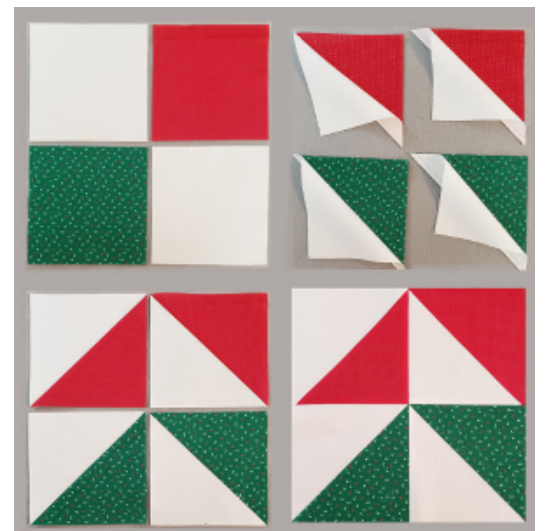
You will need to make 16 of these blocks. They should measure 12" X 12" before you cut them up.

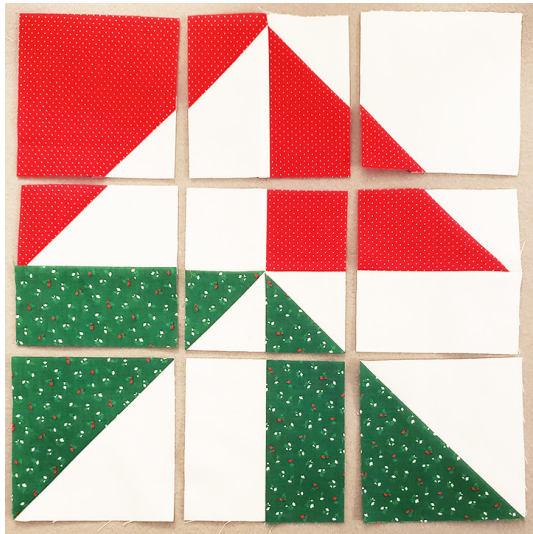

This is my seventh Disappearing Quilt pattern. It is called Jubilee and is super quick because it only uses 16 blocks!

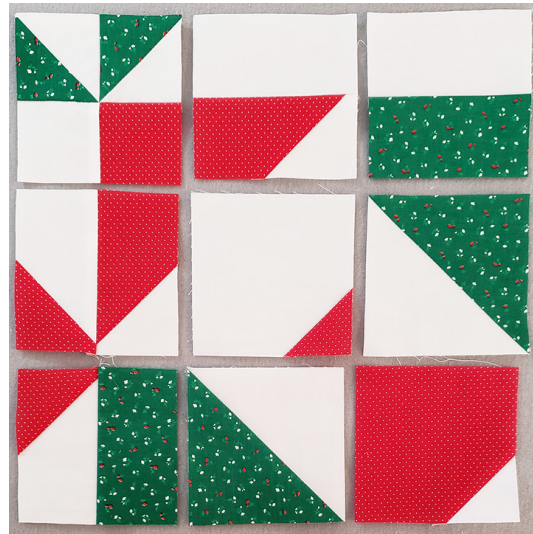

The quilt here is 42" X 42" and is made of sixteen 10 1/2" finished blocks. I used 1/2 a yard of green and 1/2 yard of red fabric and 1 yard of white or very light. These measurements don't include binding or backing.





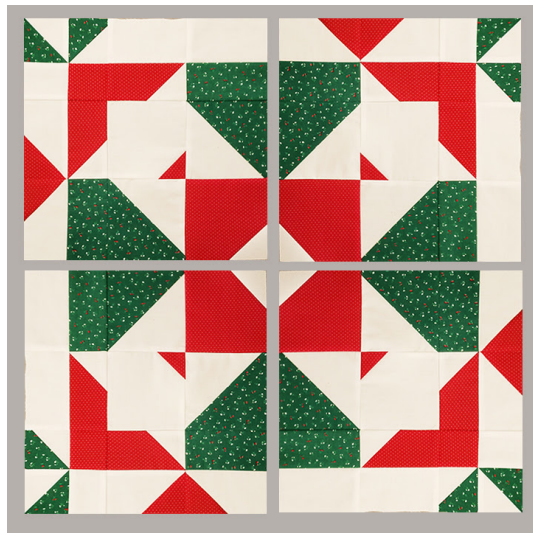
Make a cut 2" from the center seam. Turn the mat 90 degrees and make another cut the same distance from the center seam. Do this until you have 4 cuts and 9 sub-blocks.



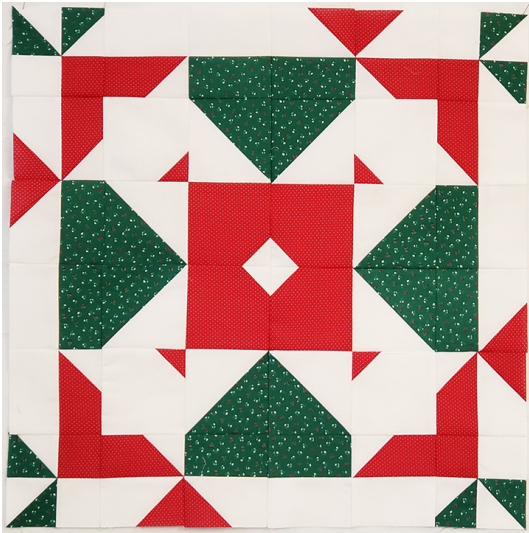
Re arrange the sub-blocks as shown.



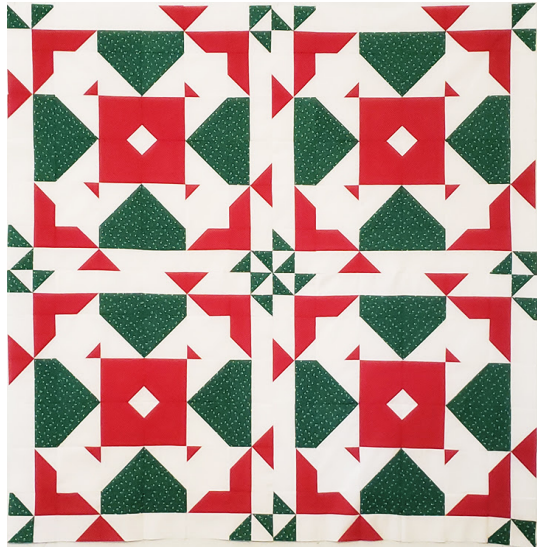
The sewn block will look like this.



Using the red block with the white corner as the center, arrange 4 blocks to make the motif.



Sewn together, the motif looks like this.

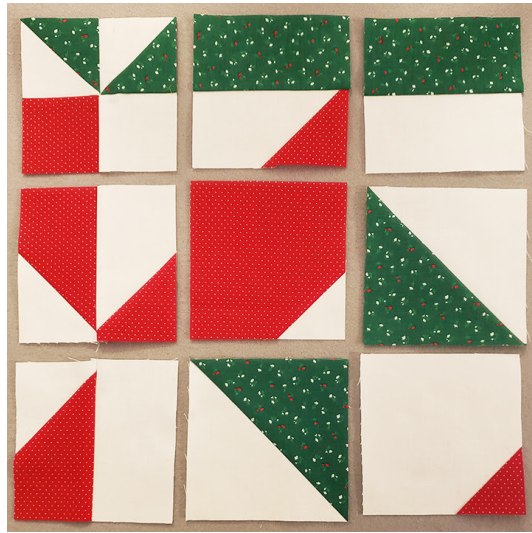


Take four of these motifs and sew them together to get the Jubilee Quilt. (shout out to Clara for the name suggestion)

You can make a negative version of this block by reversing the light and dark pieces in the original block.



This is a "Negative" image of the original block. Notice that the upper left corner HST has the red pointing outside.



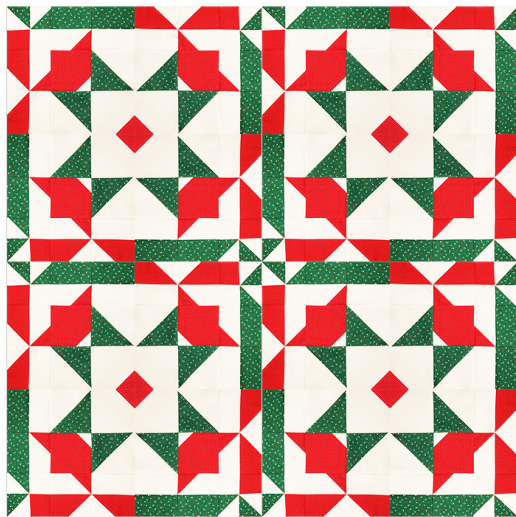
Make four cuts 2" from the center seam and re-arrange the sub-blocks as shown here.



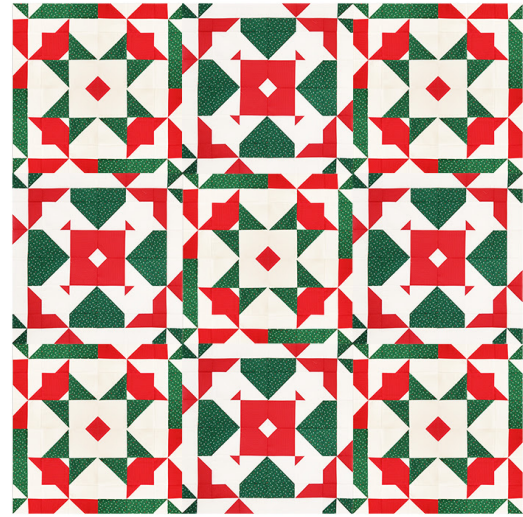
Sew the sub-blocks together.



Arrange 4 of these into a motif with the white corner with the red triangle in the middle.

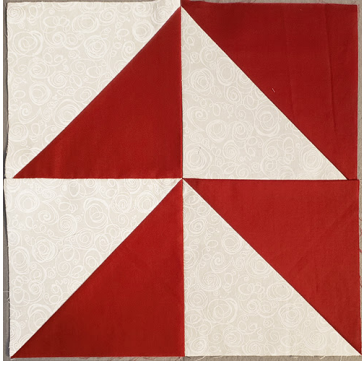


All the motifs are the same so there is no arranging when you put four together.



You could also make a quilt with alternating positive and negative motifs.

Check the end of the video to see what these quilts would look like using on 2 colors instead of 3.

1. Sawtooth Block (thank you Janet)
2. Tree Block
