Southwest Breeze! A Disappearing Flying Geese Quilt



This complicated looking quilt is surprisingly easy because it starts with Flying Geese Blocks.

This is the second in my Disappearing Flying Geese series.
This quilt measures 45" X 45". It is made up of 36 blocks. Each Block is made up of 4 HST's

Fabric Requirements: 1 3/4 Yards White
 7/8 Yard Orange
 7/8 Yard Blue/Teal



This 9" (unfinished) Flying Geese block is made of 4 Half Square Triangles that each measure 4 3/4" X 4 3/4".

You will need to make 36 of these Flying Geese.

You will need to make 72 Orange and White HST's and 72 Blue/Teal and White HST's



Make 4 cuts, each 1 1/2" from the center seam.
Rotate the mat 90 degrees after each cut.

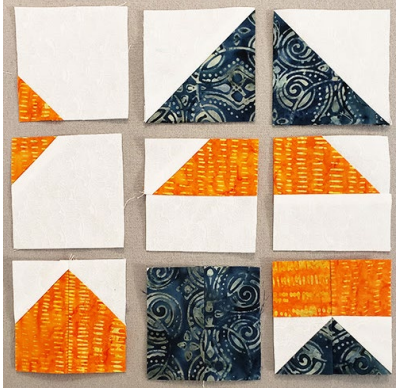
This will result in 9 sub-pieces that should measure 3" square.



Arrange the sub-pieces to match the picture above.



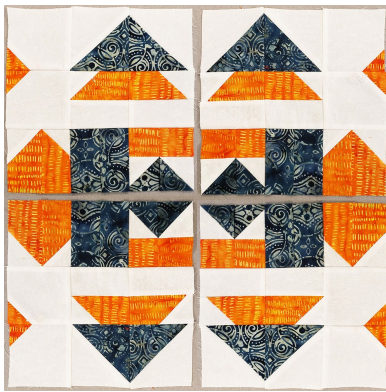
When it is sewn together it will look like this. I will refer to this as block 1.



Make a mirror image of the first block.
Arrange it as above.



It looks like this when sewn together. I will refer to this as block 2.



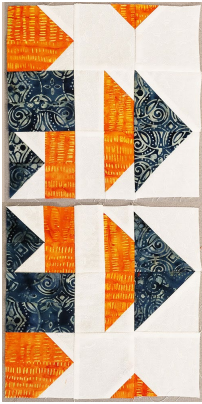
Arrange two of Block 1 and two of Block 2 into the motif shown above.
This is a 4-block motif.



This is what the 4-Block motif will look like when sewn together.



Rows 1 and 3 will look like this with three of the 4-Block Motifs in a row



Make a 2-Block, half motif for the left side of row 2.



The Center of the row will be made up of the 4-Block motifs.



Make the opposite 2-Block, half motif for the right side of row 2.



Start and end the rows with the 2-Block Half Motifs. This will offset the motifs and create the zig zag design between the rows.



Here is what the quilt will look like when it is all sewn together.
